IQAC Review of Stakeholder Feedback – Students, Faculty, and Alumni for the 2022-23 Academic Year, Integrated into the Action Plan for the Next Academic Session

The feedback collected from students through an online survey (Google Form) covered areas such as teaching methodologies, availability of study resources, academic atmosphere, personality development initiatives, and other essential needs. Students rated their experiences on a scale of excellent, good, and average.

For faculty, the feedback was centered on course design and evaluation, including aspects like course objectives, content, relevance, learning outcomes, optional modules, scope, and the adoption of innovative teaching strategies. Faculty responses were also categorized as excellent, good, or average.

Alumni feedback, a key input for institutional growth and enhancement, focused on distinct parameters. Their responses were similarly rated in to four and five parameters based on Likert Scale. Under the leadership of the Principal, the IQAC Committee reviewed the feedback and proposed strategic recommendations, committing to implement the necessary improvements for the advancement of the institution.




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Analysis Report of Student Feedback Form (2022-23)

The feedback form captures student responses regarding their curriculum experience, teaching methodologies, and access to learning resources. It evaluates several key aspects of the educational framework using categorical feedback (e.g., very good, good, average, needs improvement). The total number of responses represents the collective student perspective for the academic year 2022-23.

Key Findings

1. Curriculum Relevance:

 Students provided positive feedback about the curriculum's contribution to their academic and career goals. Many found the content aligned with their expectations and aspirations.

2. Material Accessibility and Usability:

 A significant number of students acknowledged that the study material provided was easy to comprehend and practical in application, reflecting effective course material design.

3. Teaching Effectiveness:





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 Teaching methods and presentations were generally well-received. Students indicated improvement in understanding concepts due to the teaching styles adopted.

4. Impact of Study Techniques:

 Students shared mixed opinions about the influence of study techniques employed by faculty. While many deemed them effective, a noticeable fraction felt the need for enhancement in this area.

5. Availability of Additional Resources:

 The availability of supplementary study resources such as books, online classes, and laboratories received diverse feedback. While some students appreciated the resources, others suggested substantial room for improvement.

Conclusion



Key Observations:

1. Employment-Oriented Syllabus Design:

- Majority of respondents rated the syllabus as "उत्कृष्ट" (Excellent) or "अच्छा" (Good) in terms of its design for improving employment opportunities.
- Minimal responses indicate dissatisfaction.

2. Competitive Examination Preparation:

A significant number of teachers believe that the syllabus prepares students adequately for competitive exams, with most responses clustered in the "প্রভার্মা" (Good) category.

3. Modern and Advanced Topics:

The syllabus covers modern and advanced topics well, as indicated by high "अच्छा" and "उत्कृष्ट" ratings.

4. Student Interest in the Subject:





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Teachers agree that the syllabus is engaging and interesting for students, with very few responses in the "संतोषजनक" (Satisfactory) or lower categories.

5. Periodic Curriculum Updates:

Most respondents believe the curriculum is updated regularly, with "अच्छा" being the dominant rating.

6. References and Study Materials:

Availability of relevant, updated references and study materials received positive feedback.

7. Skill Development Focus:

The syllabus is well-regarded for its emphasis on skill development, with a significant number of "उत्कृष्ट" responses.

8. Self-Study Habits Development:

Responses suggest room for improvement in fostering self-study habits, as ratings are distributed more evenly across categories.

9. University's Curriculum Design:

> Teachers appreciate the clarity and appropriateness of curriculum design in alignment with program objectives.

10. Theoretical and Practical Applications:

Feedback indicates that the syllabus balances theory and practical applications well, with most responses being "স্ভান্তা."

11. Suitability and Necessity:

The course is considered suitable and essential for students, with a majority of "उत्कृष्ट" and "अच्छा" ratings.

Strengths:

- Strong focus on employment and competitive exam readiness.
- Modern and relevant syllabus content.
- Well-designed curriculum with clear objectives.





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Emphasis on skill development and practical application.

Areas for Improvement:

- Enhance mechanisms to develop self-study habits among students.
- Increase efforts to make study materials more accessible and up-to-date.

Recommendations:

- 1. **Self-Study Enhancement:** Incorporate more projects, assignments, or open-book assessments to foster independent learning.
- 2. **Material Accessibility:** Provide online resources or supplementary material to ensure students have access to the latest references.
- 3. **Teacher Training:** Conduct workshops for teachers to align their methods with modern skill-development strategies.
- 4. **Feedback Loop:** Use the feedback as a baseline for the next academic year to monitor improvements.




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Report on Parent Feedback Session 2022-23

Analysis:

- 1. Across all parameters, the majority of parents have rated the curriculum as **excellent**, highlighting their overall satisfaction.
- 2. **Self-study and confidence development** and **career preparation** received the highest ratings.
- 3. Minimal dissatisfaction indicates the curriculum meets parental expectations effectively.
- 4. Areas like **curriculum updates** and **vocational skills** can still be improved to maximize satisfaction.
